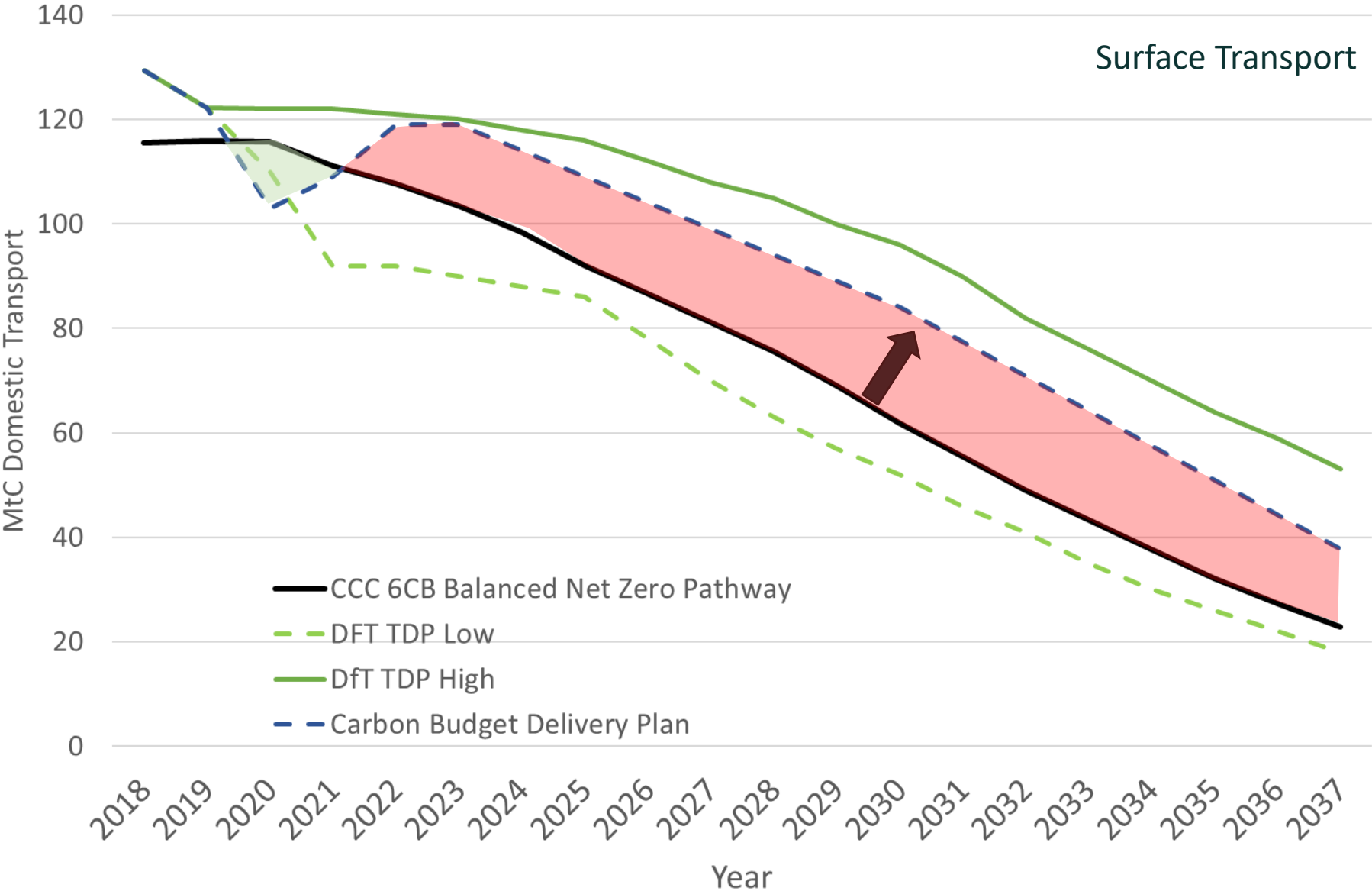

5 Key Messages

- There is a massive gap in our progress on decarbonising transport
- Whether we get back on track is about the next 7 years
- So.... we have to focus on what can be done quickly
- There are huge co-benefits from acting now
- And how we act will define fairness and efficiency for decades to come

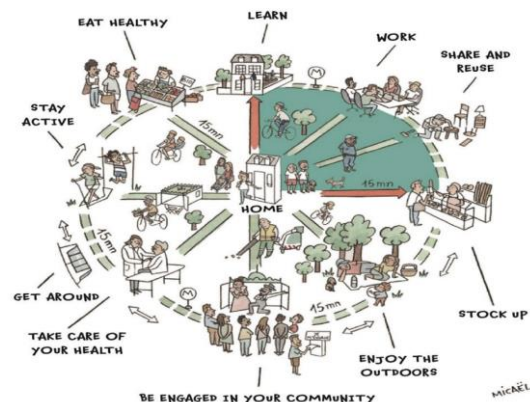

3. What can we do quickly?



Enable people to do what they want without needing the car

Provide a step change in alternatives to the car for the journeys this works for
BUS/BIKE/WALK/PLEV

Encourage more of the journeys that do need to be made by car to be shared!

3. What can we do quickly?

65% of all journeys are < 5 miles in length – but they contribute only 18% of car mileage

96% of all journeys are <35 miles in length – and they contribute 64% of car mileage

3. What can we do quickly?

- Lower investment costs in electricity network upgrades and charge points
- Physical and mental health benefits from greater active travel
- Offers a route to improve access to employment and key services for those without a car
- Promotes productivity not congestion
- Supports electrification in tackling air quality etc. etc..

5 How we act now will define fairness and efficiency for decades

- The transport system we have got does not work for everyone
- Public transport service provision is in decline
- We have not been able to fix this with the investment we have for the system
- Our current approach is about pockets of excellence not systemic change

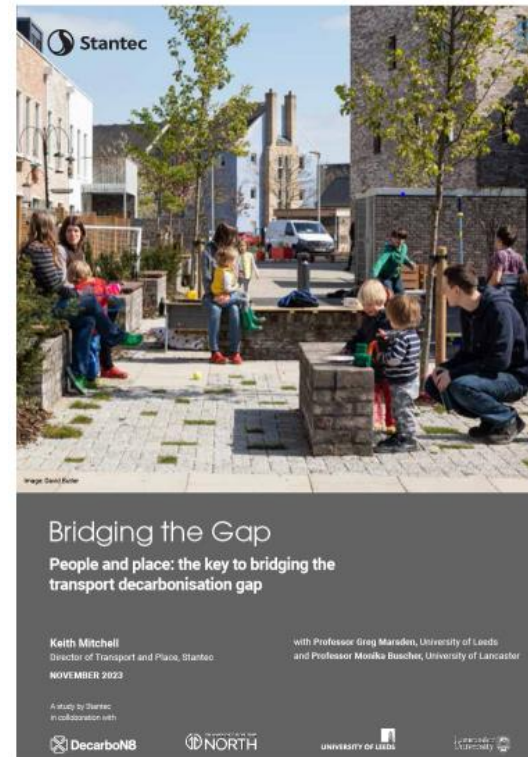
- Car driving is getting cheaper for those with the £ to go electric
