Delivering sustainable growth: How is this project delivering sustainable growth, not just now but into the future – demonstrating ambition and vision, anticipating future challenges and futureproofing growth including developing the workforce for the future? (150 words max)

Our Carbon Management Strategy for 2024-2029 details the aspirations for our journey to net zero. It shows ambition and details measures to mitigate emissions include building improvements, energy reduction, engagement with suppliers and investment in renewable energy.

Supported by a five-year Climate Action Plan it identifies actions we will take across the organisation to reduce emissions, reduce environmental inequalities and create a climate positive council culture, taking our workforce with us and building on the council's 'ecologically aware' value for now and for the future. 2MW solar farm at Sandscale Park in Barrow saving around 507 tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent annually.

Voreda House the UK's first council office building to achieve Passivhaus EnerPHit accreditation Decarbonisation Plans for our 69 schools.

we work across boundaries with a range of different partners to achieve long term green growth. For



example our solar farm project was delivered by our capital project team, in collaboration with several strategic partners and specialist advisors to bring the project to fruition through combined knowledge and expertise including;

Green Cat renewables - our strategic advisor and planning consultant

Vital Energi - detailed designs and built the scheme. Vital will maintain the farm for the first two years. Electricity Northwest - provided initial feasibility guidance for the connection of the solar farm to the local grid

PBA ecology undertook all ecological and environmental surveys for the site including reptile management, protected species mitigation and habitat planning.

PPAYA brokered the deal so we could sell the electricity at the best price possible.

We value the involvement from this extensive team of partners, for their support and expertise in making this vision a reality.

Delivering sustainable growth: How is this project proactively engaging with business to tackle problems and find solutions, stimulating the clean growth sector at the same time? (150 words max.)

As a result of our engagement with a wide range of partners we have been able to find solutions together. From partnership working on our solar farm – to partnership working on our Passivhaus staff building - we have worked with a range of businesses to ensure we are on track to meet and exceed our targets and support the council's ambitions to become net zero in a sustainable way. On Nutrient Neutrality we are working in partnership with the Lake District National Park Authority, Cumberland Council and Yorkshire Dales National Park to address the issue. Our Rural Net Zero project is a partnership with Cumbria Action for Sustainability, Cumbria Tourism and three partner businesses. It has secured £150,000 to support research and this is one of 14 pathfinder projects which aims to help places and businesses across the UK to accelerate the delivery of the transition to net zero.
