1.	Welcome and Introductions	Steve Read
	SR welcomed everyone and gave a special welcome to those joining for the first time - Quinton Carroll, John Meehan and Dan Clayton introduced themselves. Dan standing in for David Hickman (Lincolnshire). John standing in for Sam Kennedy (Essex). Quinton (representing Cambridgeshire along with Emma Fitch).	
	SR explained that the monthly meetings starting during Covid and proved useful. A decision needs to be made as to whether the monthly meetings continue after the Q3 meeting on 28 th July.	
2.	Covid-19 and general service resilience / recovery	All
	Covid is still very much an issue in West Sussex Place but impacting social care and education more than Place services.	
	Self-isolation of contractor staff after positive testing is having some, but so far limited, impact.	
	Rates are rising but the bigger proportion is among young people.	
	Feed from the CEx when talking to Government is that civil servants are losing interest and want to talk about something else.	
	Peter Moore, Reading, reported they have had surge testing with people at national level attending.	
	Quinton Carroll, Cambridgeshire, reported very low rates but a significant increase in infection rates particularly in schools.	

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Ralph Kemp, Cheshire East, reported high infections rates. Struggling to keep all 3 services running now due to infection of RCV drivers. The Waste Group is sharing information on how the shortage of HGV drivers is impacting locally.	
Shaun Askins, Luton, commented on the lack of interest in job vacancies (running at 10%+ of the blue-collar workforce) which is impacting right across the board, not only in collection services. Summer holiday season will bring further pressure. Pressures include fewer workers from the EU and an ageing workforce.	
Steve Read noted that the ESA have called on government to relax restrictions regarding driver training and working hours.

Government consultation on elements of the Resources and Waste Strategy. ADEPT had responded to the consultation on the waste prevention program. Responses are also on the website for the EPR and DRS consultations. Consistency in Collections consultation deadline is Sunday 4 th July. This is the one that has most impact on local authority service provision with a mandatory collection of food waste and a separate collection of a range of recyclables (tetrapack and plastic films and flexibles). A working group meets weekly to discuss consultation responses. The final meeting is tomorrow morning 09:00-10:00 after which the response will be submitted. A meeting with Defra took place yesterday. Written ministerial statement was published on 22 nd June. Defra are still formalising its response which will be part response and part consultation. There will be opportunities for Local Authorities as well as ADEPT to contribute. It was noted that the intention within senior levels is to press for primary legislation in terms of AONB and national parks. The Glover Review is being planned for the agenda of the next quarterly Board meeting.
